The first quarter of FY 2024-25 has seen CanSupport roll out its plan for expanding its home based palliative care program to newer geographies in the country: Jhajjar (Haryana) already operationalized in June with a committed grant support from Cipla Foundation, and Patiala (Punjab) and Shimla (Himachal Pradesh) to be launched in August.

Our faith and trust in what palliative care can achieve, the right of all people to lead a dignified life free of pain, as well as our commitment to provide access to this care to the most cancer heavy parts of India, are the foundation of all that goes on at CanSupport. We are here to help make this possible through the wonderfully enriching partnerships that we enjoy together with you.

New Centre Set Up in Jhajjar, Haryana

In our ever enduring quest to cater to the unmet needs among the wider cancer population, we are going to add a new centre at Jhajjar, Haryana. The training has been completed and the teams shall start the operations in July. We are grateful to Dr Sushma Bhatnagar (Dr BRI-IRCH, AIIMS) as she continues to assist us in our endeavours. Continuing the progression, we are planning to expand in Shimla and Patiala as well.

We shall continue to provide excellent home care service and continually build the offerings as we spread our reach further.

MOUs Signed for Extending Service Provision

We have signed new MOUs with National Cancer Institute (NCI), AIIMS, Jhajjar and Pt. Bhagwat Dayal Sharma Post Graduate Institute of Medical Sciences (PGIMS), Rohtak. We will continue to mobilise referrals for patients requiring home based care. In addition, counsellors will be deployed in the hospital's premises for addressing psychosocial needs of patients taking treatment in these institutions as well as their caregivers.

Meanwhile, revisions have been made to agreements in Bathinda with AllMS and Advanced Cancer Institute. Starting 3rd June, our OPD services have been made available full five days a week at both the facilities.

TRAINING, EDUCATION & RESEARCH

The 21st Annual Foundation Course in Palliative Care - AIIMS, New Delhi









TQMRU (Training, Quality, Management and Research Unit) tam conducted the 21st Annual Foundation Course in Palliative Care on the 11th & 12th of March at the Jawaharlal Nehru Auditorium in AllMS, New Delhi in collaboration with the Dr. B R Ambedkar Institute Rotary Cancer Hospital, Prof. Dr Sushma Bhatnagar (Dr BRI-IRCH, AllMS) and other faculty members from AllMS were greatly instrumental in organizing the event.

Aimed at providing an introductory understanding of palliative care, the workshop laid emphasis on pain and symptom management. Varied other aspects of palliative care were also addressed to instil the candidates with a genuine desire to effectively handle patient care.

The 180 attendees comprised of participants from several institutions such as Fortis Hospital, Rajiv Gandhi Cancer Institute, Noida International Institute of Allied Sciences, and Metro College of Nursing. The Delhi Laughter Club emphasised how hearty laughs are essential for self-care through their Laughter Therapy session.

Continuing Nursing Education (CNE) Workshops on Palliative Care Nursing

The team organized two-day Continuing Nurse Education (CNE) workshops on Basic Palliative Care at two locations in the months of April and May. The objective of these workshops was to provide awareness and understanding of palliative care to the students and faculty with key topics being the fundamentals of alleviative care, pain and wound management, communication skills, and end-of-life care.

At R&R Army Hospital, Delhi the sessions were held on the 9th & 10th of April for about 150 students and faculty members.

The BSc students at Metro College of Nursing in Noida took part in the sessions on the 27th & 28th of May. The workshop commenced with Kanak Lata (Director of Education), Parvin Parkash









(Principal), Sneha Pravin (Vice Principal) and other faculty in attendance. The Guest Speaker, Vijay Kumar from AIIMS, IRCH, provided insights on lymphedema management and ostomy care. The interactions featured role-plays on effective communication and an informative Q&A session.

Both the events concluded with relaxing activities by the Laughter Clubs of Delhi and Noida, respectively.

Palliative Care in Oncology Discussed


