

From the Founder-President's Desk

Dear readers.



It has been 10 years since the World Health Assembly (WHO's Governing Body) passed a resolution calling for all countries to "strengthen palliative care as a component of comprehensive care throughout the life course." This is what inspired the theme for this year (2024): "Ten Years Since the Resolution: How are we doing?"

Progress has been made over the years internationally, regionally, and locally. The number of facilities for care facilities increased and efforts have been made to integrate palliative care services in healthcare systems. From 2011 to 2017, the number of palliative care services increased from 16,000 to 25,000, caring for 7 million patients, but still only about 12% of the global need was met. We still have a long way to go.

More than 60 million people both adults and children need palliative care services every year with over 80% living in low-middle-income (LMIC's) countries. While it has been estimated by the World Hospice & Palliative Care Association that over half of the need for palliative care has been met in the developed world this is certainly not true for India. We are meeting just 2% of the need which is why we are rated as one of the worst countries in which to die.

We must train more health professionals in palliative care as well as make pain medications, especially oral morphine, so essential for good pain control, more widely available. Otherwise, we run the risk of being labelled as a nation low on compassion and empathy for the seriously sick and dying.

This year, let's make it our mission to advocate for the inclusion of palliative care in our public health system so that people in rural and remote areas of our country do not suffer needlessly and can access the care they need.

CANSUPPORT CONTINUES EXPANSION

We are always excited to join hands with co-advocates and agencies which empower us to march onwards and are glad that we have been able to do so together with expanding in more regions.

In August, we opened the Shimla centre to spread our reach to Himachal Pradesh. The team comprises of Dr Sushant, Nurse Shubhangi, Counsellor Sangeeta, and Public Relations Officer (PRO) Rakesh. We had signed an agreement with Indira Gandhi Medical College & Hospital (IGMC), Shimla and are thankful to them and Cipla for making this possible. Given the challenging regional terrain, it is difficult for patients, especially the severely ill, to access the hospital and medical facilities. Therefore, our teams can make a considerable impact by providing essential palliative care through home visits and 24x7 call support.

In the same month, we also branched towards Patiala. Suri Seva Foundation has been instrumental in setting up the centre there and we are grateful for their support. The team made up of Dr Harbans, Nurse Kuljeet Kaur, Nurse Counsellor Renu, and PRO Amandeep has already started assisting those in need of urgent care being proximate to Rajindra Hospital.

In another development, we have added a second team in Rohtak, Haryana. Dr Rajiv, Nurse Seema, Nurse Counsellor Babita, Hospital Counsellor Neetu, and PRO Pradeep have begun furthering our work there.



TRAINING, EDUCATION & RESEARCH

5th Continuing Medical Education of Delhi State Chapter of IAPC organised







TQMRU (Training, Quality, Management and Research Unit) team organised the 5th CME (Continuing Medical Education) of the Delhi State Chapter of IAPC (Indian Association of Palliative Care), titled "Finding Light in the Shadows: End of Life Care in Last Days and Hours," on Saturday, 6 July. The event, graced by chief guests Dr. Seema Mishra, Dr. Sushma Bhatnagar, and Dr. Ambika Rajvanshi, saw the participation of around 50 attendees. Sessions were informative and featured esteemed external speakers who provided valuable insights into end-of-life care. A notable highlight was a role play on communication performed by AIIMS residents, which was both engaging and educational. The feedback emphasised the practical benefits of the sessions.

Overall, the CME was a great success, and fostered a collaborative spirit among palliative care professionals. We are enthused to hold similar events in the future to continue enhancing the quality of end-of-life care.

MOU signed with O.P. Jindal Global University, Introductory Session held

We are exhilarated to have signed an MOU with O.P. Jindal Global University (JGU), Sonipat, Haryana to collaborate and we shall be exchanging academic and clinical skills together with jointly working on professional capacity building and training interventions among other objectives.

The team conducted a two-hour workshop on palliative care for students of MPH (Masters of Public Health) sand faculty at the university with Dr Ishita Gandhi and Pandey speakers. Anamika interactive session introduced foundational principles and its impact on improving quality of life for individuals with serious and life-limiting conditions. Insights into the psychological dimensions of palliative care, with emphasis on empathy and effective communication as key elements were also shared.









The session underscored the importance of educational outreach in palliative care, marking a valuable step in deeper understanding and collaboration within realms of public health.

Students and faculty engaged actively and enthusiastically queried about practices, dynamics, and real world challenges faced in the field.



TRAINING, EDUCATION & RESEARCH

Observerships by candidates from our collaborators

We had more than 60 participants do observerships with our teams for which they went on visits as part of our collaboration with Indian Association of Palliative Care (IAPC), Delhi. The candidates from AIIMS Hospital got the opportunity to observe and learn our methods and practices. These learnings greatly help in replicating the same for their respective departments' smoother functioning. Apart from those in Delhi-NCR, peripheral centres in Uttar Pradesh, Punjab, and Haryana were also involved.

In addition to them, Dr Sahil from Cipla, who are also one of our collaborators, experienced how a typical week for CanSupport teams goes as well. He got to better understand how systems are run and palliative care is provided to our patients and the caregivers through home visits, day care and other programs.

We encourage our partners, collaborators, and workers from our sector to get first-hand experience of how we operate and we had several visitors over the months at our various centres.

Mr Janardan and Mr Yashwant from Cipla visited our Mansa, Punjab centre and interacted with the team to understand their functioning and about their operations.[1]

We had Devanshi Vaid and Srishti Gupta from India Development CSNE, who observed and took interviews to develop a feature and create content pieces on palliative care to be published on IDR portal.[2] Lalith Parmar, President of Sankalp India, an organisation working in prevention, management, and cure for thalassemia in Bengaluru, was joined by Amrita from MK Hamied foundation and they both got to gain knowledge about our work with emphasis on training and quality control.[3]

A group of 4 nurses and a doctor from Arunachal Pradesh accompanied one of our teams and they carefully observed them. It was an opportunity for them to learn more about palliative care.[4] Aparna Sah, from Karuna Evan Shanti Vahini Foundation in Bandra, Mumbai, went with our team and was extremely moved to see their dedication and the quality of care they provide. She was focused towards seeing how we operate in the urban areas and was amazed with the meticulous documentation system, and the efficacy of Seva app.

We had international visitants at our head office as well who wanted to see our workings. Dr Maria L. Ekstrand, PhD, Professor Emeritus of Medicine in the Prevention Science Division for AIDS prevention studies, University of San Francisco, California, gained insight into our work through conversations with our staff and learning about the departments. We also got interns from American universities who engaged in activities to get some practical experience.[5]



TRAINING, EDUCATION & RESEARCH

Shimla team engages with the community

A workshop on Palliative Care was organised at Cancer Hospital, Shimla in August where information regarding the nature of care we provide was shared with the attendees.

Our team also conducted a cancer awareness session during the All India Women's Conference in September and the participants eagerly queried about prevention, early detection, and how they can further spread the knowledge gained.





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Certificate Course in Counselling Completed

The Certificate Course of Palliative Counselling was successfully concluded in August with the participants having picked up the concepts and practices of palliative care. They got further familiarised to be able to apply the learnings in the field work.

Workshops conducted in NCR Universities

A workshop on "Introduction to Palliative Care" was conducted at Shri Atal Bihari Vajpayee Government Medical College (ABV GMC) in Chhainsa, Faridabad. About 150 MBBS students and 20 faculty members from the radiation oncology, ENT, and orthopaedics departments. Dr Smita Taneja took the session and spoke about pain management as well. Anamika Pandey shared about communication, how to 'break the bad news', and collusion.

Another session was held at Gautam Buddha University (GBU), Greater Noida was organised for students of psychology and social work. Anamika Pandey and Dr Ravinder Mohan interacted with about 200 attendees and gave them crucial information to further explore concepts.

The feedback from participants was overwhelmingly positive, highlighting an eagerness to delve deeper into palliative care.

EIH LIMITED (FROM THE OBEROI GROUP)

An MOU was signed between CanSupport and EIH Limited, a flagship company of The Oberoi Group, in August 2024 to mark a beginning of a partnership committed to filling a critical gap in the continuum of care of patients with advanced cancer and empowerment of their caregivers.

Besides their commitment to ethical behavior in business, EIH Limited also extend its responsibility towards the environment and communities in which it operates and has several corporate social responsibility (CSR) activities, which include Environmental responsibility, Education and healthcare, Community development, Skill enhancement etc. One of the activities that the Company's CSR policy focuses on is 'caring for the elderly and addressing their health issues'.

With their assistance, CanSupport has been able to successfully start executing the planned project since its inception in April 2024. The beneficiaries of the programs supported by EIH Limited include elderly Cancer patients above 60 years of age suffering from all cancer types at all cancer stages in Delhi, NCR and Punjab. Apart from cancer, the elderly patients suffering from other serious illnesses like neuro-degenerative illnesses, or even those who are bedridden are being cared for in their homes. In addition to caring for the senior citizens, they have also contributed towards other programs which include Day Care, Ration Support, and Physical Rehabilitation through providing vital equipment, chemotherapy drugs etc.

The project has been initiated with five multidisciplinary teams made up of doctors, nurses, counsellors, and physiotherapists. The key deliverables include serving about 500 senior patients, and approximately 1,500 family caregivers, and nearly 4,000 young patients and caregivers visiting the Clinic & Day Care as beneficiaries and we are on track to accomplishing them through the home visits.

All aspects of quality of life - physical, functional, emotional, interpersonal and transcendental - are impacted by CanSupport's methodical approach, which offers patients pragmatic strategies to reclaim their sense of control. In addition, it gives families the knowledge and confidence to decide on care objectives as well as skills to cope and care, and also arrange resources to make an arduous journey manageable, significant, and unforgettable for all. We remain thankful for collaborations such as one we have got with EIH Limited, for the work we get enabled to do towards our cause.

REMEMBERING MR HARCHARAN SINGH SURI

Mr Harcharan Singh Suri, a cherished and respected friend, mentor, devoted family man and philanthropist, passed away peacefully on October 5, 2024, at 84, surrounded by his loving family in Oakton, Virginia. His life was a testament to love, faith, and purpose.
